There is a wealth of useful information online but finding exactly what you want can be difficult. A good place to start is with **responsible and safer browsing**. **Web browsing is a skill**.

• When browsing online **try using more than one word** to help you get more useful results.

- Avoid using rude or inappropriate words to help reduce the risk of unwanted results.
- Check a few different sources and websites to help ensure accurate results.
- Talk to a trusted adult if you have seen or heard something online that has upset you.
- Bookmark your favourite websites.

Gooseberry Teacher 'Tips' of the week

When asking learners to 'do research', support them with safer and responsible searching tips to help them get the results they need. **Web browsing is a skill**.

- Offering learners, a **starting point for their online research** can help them to learn safer browsing skills.
- Consider **checking out and sharing trusted websites** before setting a task to help reduce the risk of poor quality or inaccurate results.
- Creating the search criteria as part of the lesson may also help ensure success.
- Encourage learners to **check their findings across two or three different websites** and promote the use of different sources including, books and encyclopaedias.
- Consider the structure of the research tasks
- Keep outcomes specific to help learners find relevant information.

- Avoid creating, sharing, posting any inappropriate material online or the trick could be on you!
- Save 'Checking In' until you get home to help protect your whereabouts
- Avoid searching online for spooky videos and games these may be scarier than you realised
