Tip: Take a break from your tech and share some time with people in the real world.

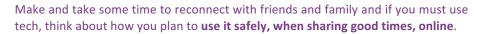

Be aware of what children are accessing online and make sure online content is appropriate for their age. You are unlikely to allow them to watch films that are unsuitable, the same idea applies to apps, games and websites.

Think about what is being shared online by the whole family and remind them to manage digital footprints with careful sharing online.

In the news... Are Facebook really making it safer for children to chat online?

How **do you** help keep children safer when chatting and social networking online? How **would you** help manage the number of unauthorised and underage users of social networking apps?

Facebook have recently launched a modified version of their popular 13+ social networking app, aimed specifically towards children under the age of 13.

The new app, called 'Messenger Kids', is currently only available on iOS and in the US but it is only a matter of time before it goes global, with its availability on Android expected soon. The free chat app for under 13s boasts stricter parental controls that include permission and 'friend' approval, child-friendly features, screened content and safety filters.

This idea raises some interesting questions and perhaps, quite rightly, some concern. It is a case of 'watch this online space' as we will be monitoring the reactions and developments regarding this app as they unfold.
